


## Stakeholder Engagement Guide<sup>1</sup>

## Who Should Participate in Selection of Programmes?

When reviewing interventions to improve the mental health and wellbeing of children and young people using the <u>Early Intervention Framework for Children and Young People's Mental Health and Wellbeing</u>, it is helpful to bring together a diverse team of stakeholders to conduct the review, discuss potential interventions, and contribute to the selection of interventions that are a good fit for your community and the children and young people you serve. This stakeholder engagement tool can help you identify whether you have engaged people with lived experience and context expertise.

As you use the <u>Early Intervention Framework for Children and Young People's Mental Health and Wellbeing</u>, consider the following?

- Do you feel you have the right mix of people involved to understand the population, issue, and community?
- What gaps exist on your team? What steps could you take to correct for that?
